Congratulations on your decision to go for the highest award in Junior Girl Scouting- The Bronze Award! To earn this award shows you have made a promise to help others, improve your community and world, and become the best you can be.

How to Earn the Award

The following information can be found in the Junior Girl Scout Handbook.

1. Decide on your Girl Scout Bronze Award service project. Read the requirements for the project to help you decide.
2. Do the first three requirements in any order, but they must be completed **before** you start your project. *You may not use one activity to apply to more than one requirement.*
3. You can work with other girls on the Girl Scout Bronze Award Project. If you and a group of girls decide to do the project together, each girl must be responsible for a part of the project. Each must be able to show exactly what she did and what she accomplished.
4. This award can only be earned by a Junior Girl Scout (a 6th grade Junior has until September 30th following her completion of 6th grade in school). You don't have to complete a Girl Scout Bronze Award as a Junior Girl Scout – it is an option and opportunity there for you.

Upon completion of the Bronze Award:

1. Complete the Bronze Award Final Report on the next page and mail to the address at the bottom of this page. If earned individually give one copy of the form to your troop leader.
2. *****To purchase the Bronze Award Pin – After receiving the final report form, a postcard will be sent to you. Bring this postcard to the shop and purchase the Bronze Award Pin. Pins may not be purchased without a postcard.**
3. Girls who complete the Bronze Award **by May 1, 2008**, will receive a special certificate at the OGCS Reception in June 2008. For more information on this reception, see previous page.

4. Do a Girl Scout Bronze Award project.

This project shows the leadership skills you have learned as a Junior Girl Scout, and your commitment to your community and to yourself. To earn this award you will do a project that shows that you understand and live by the Girl Scout Promise and Law.

This project should:

1. Take approximately 15 hours to complete (this includes planning time).
Doing the project should take at least seven to eight hours.
2. Provide community service, but can be done in or outside of Girl Scouting.
3. Follow the Action Plan in the "Adventures of Girl Scouting" chapter of the Junior Girl Scout Handbook.

This should be a new service project that you or your troop or group have decided to do to earn this award and should not be something you have already done.

4. Follow safety rules. Check with your leader or Girl Scout advisor about which safety rules apply to your project.
5. **Describe your project and why you chose it on a separate piece of paper and attach to this form.**
6. **Mail both papers to the address at the bottom of the previous page.**
