Program Boxes

Are you looking for ways to enrich your troop's Girl Scout experience?

Program boxes and resources are now available to help leaders provide program for their troop. They may be reserved for your troop by calling or writing the Fayetteville Service Center. Please indicate: leader name and address (mailing address if we are to mail the box to you), troop number, the box you would like to use and the date (list two choices) you would like to have the box.

Program boxes may be signed out for up to 4 weeks, except the F.A.C.T program box that may be signed out for 8 weeks. Leaders are responsible for returning boxes, either by providing postage for returning by mail or by dropping the material off at the Program/Service Center in Fayetteville.

**Try-Its and badges must be purchased by the leader.*

Tennis Anyone?

For: Brownie and Junior Girl Scout Troops

Deposit Fee: \$20.00

Play tennis? Want to learn how to play tennis? Included in the box are tennis racquets, tennis balls and instructions for the leader. Deposit fee will be returned to the troop if the program box is returned in the same condition as when checked out. Patches may be purchased by completing form in box.

Zink the Zebra

For: Brownie Girl Scout Troops

Fee: \$6.00 per girl

This is an exciting program that teaches understanding, respect, compassion and acceptance of ourselves and others. Each girl will receive a Zink the Zebra beanie animal and a Zink the Zebra patch.

Safety Sense Try-it*

For: Brownie Girl Scout Troops

Fee: \$1.00 per girl

This program box will help the girls "Be Prepared" by making a safety center with important information; learn about fire, street and playground safety, and to learn about first aid. Girls will earn the Safety Sense Try-it.

F.A.C.T. – First Aid for Children Today - American Red Cross

For: Brownie Girl Scout Troops

Fee: \$2.50 per girl

This program enables the girls to help themselves and others, be aware of dangers, prevent injuries and respond when injuries do happen. They also learn how to help the environment. Fee includes activity book and supplies.

Listening to the Past Try-it*

For: Brownie Girl Scout Troops

Fee: \$5.00 usage fee

This program box will help the girls learn about how people used to live and what children did a long time ago.

NOTE: This will complete 3 (#4, 5, 6) out of 4 required activities for the Try-It.

GirlSports Try-It*

For: Brownie Girl Scout Troops

Fee: \$5.00 usage fee

This program box will help the girls prepare for sports by teaching them the basics – to throw, catch, volley and kick. Includes : bean bags, paddles & balloons.

Eat Right, Stay Healthy Try-It*

Fee: \$5.00 usage fee

Girls learn more about good food and that what you eat affects your health.

Drawing and Painting Junior Badge*

For: Junior Girl Scout Troops

Fee: \$1.00 per girl

Complete this badge with these supplies - paints, pastels, chalk, paper, and articles on women artists.

3-D Art Junior Badge*


For: Junior Girl Scout Troops

Fee: \$1.00 per girl

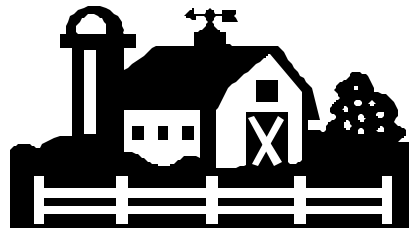
Brownie Roundup

Eagle Watch

The majesty of a bald eagle is an experience that lasts a lifetime. Each year approximately 100 bald eagles visit Bull Shoals Lake and surrounding areas. Girl Scouts will be able to describe the physical attributes of these birds that help them fly, find food, and migrate. The girls will make a classmate into a bird and discuss the different features and adaptations of that bird. They will learn the importance of each feature and how it enables the bird to survive in its habitat. Finally they will compare the features of an eagle to their own features. Examples: wing span/arm span, speed, weight, height, foot size etc.

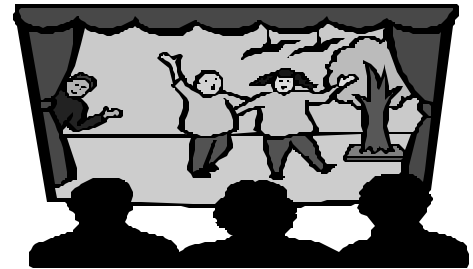
Brownie "Play in a Day"
